PURPOSE

The Board of Aldermen held a public hearing and received comments on the revised Minimum Housing Code, new Chapter 17 of the Town Code, on March 22, 2005. Follow-up information was requested. The staff recommends adoption of the ordinance that revised the Town Code to include a new Chapter 17, Housing.

INFORMATION

The proposed minimum housing code has been revised to reflect comments and Board direction from the public hearing on March 22^{nd} . The revised draft and summary table are attached (*Attachments A and B*). The minutes from the public hearing and additional written comments that were submitted are attached (*Attachment C*). Memos from Mike Brough, Town Attorney and Stan Foushee, Fire Marshal, respond to the questions related to proposed housing code revisions (*Attachments D and E*). It should be noted that the minimum housing code does not propose any additional sprinkler requirements, it only mirrors the provisions found elsewhere in the Town Code. A summary of the comments received at the public hearing and a staff response is provided below.
