### A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE STREET LIGHTING POLICY Resolution No. 22/2005-06

WHEREAS, on January 25, 2005, the Board instructed the town staff to develop a procedure to allow residents of Northeast Annexation Areas to decline street lighting; and

WHEREAS, the Board is still cognizant of the fact that state law requires that the Town provide services in all annexed areas commensurate with those provided in the rest of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVEDBY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen hereby approves the proposed amendment to the Town's Street Lighting Policy.

Section 2. The Board of Aldermen confirms that this amendment shall apply only to annexations of well-established neighborhoods and *not* to new developments or subdivisions, which are required to comply with the street lighting policy as part of the conditional use permit process.

Section 3. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

# PROPOSED AMENDMENT

## Annexation Area Street Lighting - Amending Normal Town Street Lighting Policy

- I. Preliminary Plan: The town will use the existing street lighting policy to prepare a preliminary plan for street light locations in the annexed area. Since state law requires the town to offer equal services in the annexed area, such a lighting plan must be the starting point for any discussion of service changes.
- II. Petition for Exemption: A valid petition for exemption from the street lighting policy must be signed by 100% of the property owners with frontage on a particular street. The Town will make official petition forms available at least two months before the date of effective annexation. Completed forms must be submitted to the Director of Public Works within a time frame to be specified by Town staff and not to be less than one month after the forms are made available (to allow time for planning and installation of the street lights). Town staff will determine whether each petition is valid and will notify a resident designated on the petition form as a contact person whether the request has been granted.

### III. Special Conditions:

- a. Because of the legal requirements about service provision, any street which elects *not* to receive lighting *will* receive lighting in the future if *any* of the property owners of that street request it from the town.
- b. Once street lights are put in on a street, they will not be removed (even if all property owners were to achieve unanimity of opinion against them).
- c. Though a particular street may have declined street lights, street lights may still be placed at intersections with roads which have not declined lights.

WHEREAS, a new fire station to serve the northern portions of the Town has for several years been among the highest priorities on the Town's Capital Improvements Program; and

WHEREAS, continued growth in the northern portions of the Town only increases the need for this proposed fire station; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro has for several years been investigating several possible sites for the proposed new fire station, but has not yet been successful in negotiating the voluntary purchase and sale of a satisfactory site;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO RESOLVES:

- Section 1. The Board instructs the administration to continue its efforts to locate and negotiate a voluntary contract of purchase and sale for a satisfactory site to construct a new fire station to better serve the northern portions of the Town;
- Section 2. If a voluntary purchase and sale contract for such a site is not executed by June 7, 2005, the Board hereby states its intention to initiate proceedings to acquire a satisfactory site using the Town's power of eminent domain.
  - Section 3. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
