Re: Smith Level Road Task Force creation

Smith Level Road is a scenic country road running along the perimeter of the University Lake watershed. Several farms are still operational along the road and recently a new riding stable has gone into business. Smith Level has also become a favorite shortcut for large tractor trailers traveling between 15-501 and highway 54 and for commuters who work in town and reside in counties south of Orange. While the posted speed limit on Smith Level is 45, the average speed is closer to 55.

We, the undersigned residents of south Orange County who live on or just off Smith Level Road, are concerned about this volume of traffic, and especially the heavy truck traffic. We expect the current situation to worsen between now and fall 2007 when Carrboro High School opens.

We hereby request the Carrboro Board of Aldermen to convene a Smith Level Road Task Force, similar to the successful Homestead Road task force, to identify proactive safety measures that will:

- 1. Protect the fragile land within the watershed
- 2. Provide a safe, non-vehicular trail or sidewalks to Carrboro High School for children living along Smith Level Road between the Carrboro town limit and 15-501
- Provide safe access for residents whose driveways or subdivisions are located on or along Smith Level.

Dear Mayors Foy and Nelson:

During our Assembly of Governments (AOG) meeting on October 15th, a citizen, Sharon Cooke, spoke regarding pedestrian, bicycling and traffic Issues along a section of Homestead Road within our joint planning area. She represented 'Students on Sidewalks' and asked for help from our local governments to find solutions to improve public safety in the area.

A short-term task force was suggested to address interim solutions with the understanding that ultimately road improvements are scheduled for the area.

Our commission on December 1 began the suggested process of formulating the task force with the intention that our collective elected bodies assign community representatives and appropriate staff members to recommend public safety initiatives for the area.

Each elected body can of course refine the basic charge noted in our abstract and/or wait for the organizational meeting for further discussion. We have appointed Sharon Cooke as our Orange County citizen-representative and will designate a Commissioner to be the primary liaison to the task force. Our respective transportation planning staffs have already begun researching some technical aspects and funding sources with the MPO and NCDOT.
