
## A RESOLUTION RECEIVING THE NEW HORIZONS TASK FORCE UPDATE ON TRANSITION ISSUES AND REQUESTING ADDITIONAL UPDATES Resolution No. 27/2006-07


WHEREAS the Board of Aldermen commissioned the New Horizons Task Force to study and help with transition issues relating to the newly annexed areas; and

WHEREAS, the New Horizons Task Force has now met four times, completed a resident survey, and herewith presented the survey to the Board of Aldermen along with an update of the activities of the task force;

NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Board of Aldermen receive the update and survey report.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Aldermen request at least two more updates before the mandate for the New Horizons Task Force expires in July 2007.





WHEREAS, close to 300 households in northern Carrboro were annexed by the Town effective January 31, 2006; and


WHEREAS, the Carrboro Board of Aldermen have always sought feesback from residents and neighborhoods (as with the Neighborhood Forum), and in this case desired a fornatized communication link between themselves and residents residing in this new area of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town has established guidelines for creating advisory boards and commissions, and

WHEREAS, the New Horizons Task Force will allow residents in this new area of Town to voice their throughts and concerns to the Board of Aldermen;

RESOLUTION CREATING THE NHTF:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Aldermen authorizes the creation of a New Horizons Task Force.



## THE CHARGE OF THE NHTF:

The New Horizons Task Force will act as a natural communication conduit to the Board of Aldermen for the newly incorporated areas to address transition interests and concerns not addressed by other Town advisory boards, committees, or commissions.

MAKE-UP OF THE NEWLY ANNEXED AREA:

The newly annexed area is composed of nearly 300 households in seven areas:

• The Highlands: 33%

• Fox Meadow: 31%

• Rogers Road: 9%

• Camden: 7%

• Highlands Meadow: 7%

• Highlands North: 6%

• Meadow Run: 4%


• Other (Homestead Rd., etc.): 2%

- We have had representatives from Rogers Road, Camden and Meadow Run attend our meetings or help with NHTF tasks





- -received more surveys at the July 10 meeting -total of 92 responses from 298 households





collection, nothing has changed."


# Some survey comments ... FUTURE TRAFFIC PATTERNS "[Concerned about] turning stable neighborhoods into thoroughfares. New developments should pay full cost – sidewalks, direct connection to main roads." "Mainly, we've been dealing with mitigating the impacts of surrounding developments. I'd like the town to address future traffic patterns, at a smaller level than in existing plans."



### New residents of Carrboro:

Here are the results of the survey conducted in June and July by the New Horizons Task Force (NHTF). Thank you to the 92 households that filled out the survey. We appreciate everyone taking the time to give us your feedback about the topics we identified, and we read each and every one of your comments.

As you may recall, the NHTF is a Town of Carrboro advisory board comprised of people who live in the area recently annexed into Carrboro. The board will operate through June 2007. The NHTF serves as a communication vehicle between these new residents and the Town's Board of Aldermen, two of whom also serve as liaisons to the task force. Through this survey, NHTF members sought to find out and prioritize issues that are important to the new residents of Carrboro.

The overwhelming number one concern of new residents was taxes. At our July meeting, we had a discussion about the overall budget of Carrboro. As a point of information, nearly 50% of Carrboro's budget goes toward public safety and public works, 15% toward administration, and less than 10% each for planning, transportation, recreation, and other areas. We discussed tax relief that was available for low income households regarding property taxes.

We will be spending the rest of our meetings addressing the priorities and topics of interest raised in the surveys, most of which relate directly to our taxes. For example, two issues identified were road maintenance and sidewalks. At our July meeting, we drafted a list of questions specific to those topics. These have been sent to Town staff and answers we receive will be discussed at the August meeting. It is our hope to methodically address topic areas, gather questions about the topic at a meeting, and then discuss the answers at the next meeting. 


