PURPOSE

The purpose of this agenda item is for the Board to consider adopting a limited anti-lingering ordinance for the area around the intersection of Davie Rd. and Jones Ferry Rd. to reduce the trash and behavior problems occurring near the intersection without unduly restricting the right of people to seek work at that location. In addition, the Board is asked to consider the staff report regarding the possibility of moving the pick-up location to Town Commons, an option which might still require the adoption of the anti-lingering ordinance to succeed.

INFORMATION

This ordinance would be in effect at the aforementioned times in the public right of way 200 ft. north on Davie Rd. from its intersection with Jones Ferry Rd. and 200 ft. east and west on Jones Ferry from the intersection of Jones Ferry Rd. with Davie Rd. It would be in effect daily in a circumscribed area near the intersection of Davie Rd. and Jones Ferry Rd. from 11:00a.m. through the afternoon and night until 5:00a.m. the next morning.

FISCAL IMPACT

No fiscal impact would be anticipated for the anti-lingering ordinance alone. Moving the day laborer pick-up location to Town Commons could have a fiscal impact if additional staffing is required or additional amenities provided.

RECOMMENDATION

Town staff recommends that the Board consider adoption of this ordinance and/or taking any other actions with regard to the issue.
