### **Purpose**

The purpose of this item is for Orange County Solid Waste personnel to provide a report on the state-mandated three year update to Orange County's Ten Year Solid Waste Plan and for the Town to consider a resolution accepting the plan and offer any comments.

### **Information**

State law requires every local government entity to develop and submit a 10-year solid waste management plan and update it every 3 years. Orange County submits the plan for itself and on behalf of Carrboro, Chapel Hill, and Hillsborough. The update reaffirms the County's waste reduction goal, which is done in collaboration with the municipalities as partners in solid waste. After presenting and receiving updates from the three Towns, the plan will be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for consideration.

The current version of the plan is mostly descriptive. Solid Waste Work Group recommendations and Board of County Commissioners decisions in regards to convenience centers, rural waste collection franchising, and other topics have not been made and remain under discussion. The plan does include the waste reduction goal of 61%, which has been in place since 1997. The plan was due to the State on June 30<sup>th</sup> 2009; there have been no penalties for being late although it may limit the County's ability to obtain state grants.

County Solid Waste staff believes the plan should be submitted as soon as possible to become compliant and eligible for grants. The plan can be revised or updated at anytime as needed. The update has been presented to the Solid Waste Plan Work Group and the public for comments.
