#### **PURPOSE**

The North Carolina Department of Transportation is developing a prioritization process for statewide transportation investments from 2014-2020. NCDOT is requesting that metropolitan areas submit transportation projects for prioritization by July 2011. The Board is asked to receive a report on the process, offer comments to staff on local project priorities, and authorize the TAB to hold a public forum and develop a recommended priority list for Board consideration.

## **INFORMATION**

The outcome of this process will be a Local Priority List approved by the Board of Aldermen that contains highway, bicycle, and pedestrian projects of importance to the community. These projects will be evaluated by both NCDOT and the MPO for consideration in the 2014-2020 STIP.

The following table is a guide for what the Town should submit to the MPO, according to MPO staff instructions.

### FISCAL AND STAFF IMPACT

Staff will spend approximately 15 hours in facilitating the tasks included in the resolution in *Attachment A*.

The fiscal impact is unknown at this time. Until the 2014-2020 STIP is approved, it is uncertain what local projects will be funded in the associated fiscal years. For projects that do receive funding, their costs will be borne in whole or in part by federal and-or state transportation funding sources, which offers the potential to offset local capital project funding needs. Funded projects are likely to be scheduled for fiscal years 2016-2020.

## **RECOMMENDATION**
