The Durham Area Designers in partnership with the Town of Carrboro Planning Department will facilitate a design workshop pertaining to specific areas of the Town's Northern Study Area. The Durham Areas Designers (DAD) is a non-profit group of local design professionals who specialize in facilitating community design workshops.

*Part I, a*n orientation meeting, is scheduled for **February 2**, **2011**, **6:30pm to 9:30pm** and, *Part II*, an all day workshop, is scheduled for **February 26**, **2011**, **8:30am to 4:30pm**. Both events are to be held at the Morris Grove Elementary School located on Eubanks Road. (It is highly recommended that you attend the orientation meeting prior to the workshop.)

The purpose of this event is to invite community participation in exploring the possibility of neighborhood-commercial land uses and additional residential density on selected tracts of the Northern Study Area. In particular, we will focus on design implications for an assemblage of properties located on the northeast corner of Old NC 86 and Eubanks Road. In addition, we will explore related improvements to the Old NC 86 highway corridor in this vicinity. Please see the map on the reverse of this notice for the location of the study areas.

The workshop presents an opportunity for you to participate in the continuing efforts of the Town and the community to explore diversifying land use in this area. Community participation is critical to the success of this event!


During the workshop, we will break into small groups comprised of Town of Carrboro Planning Staff, DAD members, and workshop participants. DAD will have researched and gathered historical information about the surrounding areas and persons identified as resources will be interviewed prior to the workshop (who may be available for the exercise). This information will be presented by DAD facilitators at the start of the workshop in an introductory talk and also in the individual teams during the design process.

The teams will then explore design options and refine them throughout the exercise. The workshop will include intermediate presentations of the design ideas in order to obtain feedback from participants and various stakeholders in the process.

After the workshop has been held, the Durham Area Designers will present to the Board of Aldermen a summary report of possible land-use strategies in the areas of interest. Depending upon the findings of the event, the Board may consider specific rezoning recommendations.
