Candidate's Name: Carly Sieff

Date of Application: 8/11/2011

Candidate Summary: Carly had worked at the League of American Bicyclists until July 2011, working predominantly with the Bicycle Friendly Community, Business, and University programs. She was previously involved with bicycle advocacy (e.g., Washington Area Bicycle Association, The Bike House, Phoenix Bikes, & the Audubon Society of RI). Carly also founded a bicycle program (Bikes@Brown) during her time at Brown University. Currently a student in UNC's Department of City and Regional Planning (with a transportation planning concentration) and a member of the Carolina Tarwheels, Carly desires to apply her developing knowledge to local projects.

Candidate's Name: John Nicopoulos

Candidate Summary: John is a self-described, "semi-retired licensed N.C. attorney", and is therefore familiar with traffic laws and the legislative process. John claims to have been an avid cyclist of more than 30 years; as such, he believes he has insights into the issues associated with simultaneously considering the rights and responsibilities of all road users. Candidate Summary: Linda, a resident of Carrboro for 21 years, states that she has significant knowledge of the town's transportation issues and plans. She also maintains strong interest in bicycle commuting and recreation. Linda had previously worked with a number of community groups, including service as a PTA council member for Carrboro's schools.
