RESOLUTION OPPOSING PLANNED LAUNCH OF THE CASSINI SPACE PROBE

Gary Giles presented a petition from the Orange County Peace Coalition urging the Board of Aldermen to go on record not only to express concern for the possible dangers to public health, but to appeal to the President to postpone planned space missions using plutonium as a source of power for the instruments on board until an alternative, safer technology is developed.

The following resolution was introduced by Alderman Jacquelyn Gist and duly seconded by Alderman Hank Anderson.

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE PLANNED LAUNCH OF THE CASSINI SPACE PROBE

Resolution No. 11/97-98

WHEREAS, NASA is planning to launch the Cassini space probe on October 13, 1997 from Cape Canaveral, Florida to explore Saturn; and

WHEREAS, the Cassini space probe will be carrying 72.3 pounds of plutonium 238 to supply power to the instruments on board; and

WHEREAS, since plutonium is one of the most toxic chemicals known and mishaps are very possible; and

WHEREAS, since there have been previous accidents with space vehicles and the current problems with the Cassini mission, the risks are too great. The risks come from Cassini's Titan IV rocket launch and its returning flyby in 1999 from Venus to Earth to gain velocity to pass Jupiter enroute to Saturn; and

WHEREAS, there is concern that future missions are scheduled to continue to use plutonium as a power source. It is requested that use of plutonium be discontinued until other sources of energy, such as the high-performance solar cells being developed in Europe, be used.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO DO HEREBY RESOLVE:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen wishes to express its concern for the possible dangers to public health, and appeal to President Clinton to postpone these planned space missions using plutonium as a source of power for the instruments on board until an alternative, safer technology is developed.

Section 2. A copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to President Clinton.

Section 3. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.


PUBLIC HEARING/ZONING MAP AMENDMENT/REZONING OF 402 JONES FERRY ROAD

The purpose of this item was for the Board of Aldermen to hold a public hearing to consider the rezoning of 1.5 acres of property located at 402 Jones Ferry Road from R-7.5 to M-1.

Roy Williford, Planning Director, presented the proposal for rezoning. Mr. Williford stated that the town staff recommended approval of the proposed rezoning.

Mayor Nelson pointed out that the Planning Board had voted to recommend approval of the rezoning.

Cliff Collins stated that he would like to move his wholesale business to the Jones Ferry Road site. Mr. Collins stated that the oil tanks would be removed from the property.



Alberta Neely, a resident of Prince Street, questioned the location of the proposed rezoning.

Ellen Perry questioned how much additional truck traffic Jones Ferry Road can accommodate.

Judy Anderson asked whether Mr. Collins' business expansion would produce more jobs. Ms. Anderson expressed concern about additional large trucks on Jones Ferry Road. Ms. Anderson asked suggested that the speed limit on Jones Ferry Road be reviewed.

MOTION WAS MADE BY HANK ANDERSON AND SECONDED BY JACQUELYN GIST TO ADOPT THE ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CARRBORO ZONING MAP TO REZONE ONE LOT (1.5 ACRES IN SIZE) LOCATED AT 402 JONES FERRY ROAD FROM R-7.5 (RESIDENTIAL, MINIMUM 7,500 SQUARE FEET PER DWELLING UNIT) TO M-1 (LIGHT MANUFACTURING)." VOTE: AFFIRMATIVE ALL

PUBLIC HEARING/LAND USE ORDINANCE TEXT AMENDMENT TO ESTABLISH LIMITS ON MULTI-FAMILY UNITS, DUPLEXES, AND TWO-FAMILY APARTMENTS CONTAINING FOUR OR MORE BEDROOMS.

The Board of Aldermen, on September 16th, received a request from Ms. Jane Burns representing "The Neighbors for the Responsible Development of Old Pittsboro Road" to rezone the Pittsboro Road area to accurately reflect current or existing land uses. On September 23, 1997 the Board of Aldermen decided to address the concerns expressed by Ms. Burns by setting this public hearing to consider an ordinance amending the Land Use Ordinance to establish limits on multi-family units, duplexes, and two-family apartments containing four or more bedrooms.

Roy Williford explained the proposed amendment and presented two alternative ordinances for the Board's consideration. Alternative A creates sub-classifications for duplex, two-family, and multi-family housing that allows units with 3 or less bedrooms and units with more than 3 bedrooms. Alternative B provides some flexibility by allowing developments to have a maximum of 20% of its units with more than three bedrooms.

Andy Cohen, Chair of the Planning Board, stated that the Planning Board reviewed this ordinance with no particular project in mind. Mr. Cohen stated that the Planning Board voted unanimously against both proposed alternative ordinances. Mr. Cohen stated that the Planning Board felt that the proposed ordinances would not be good zoning policy for the Town of Carrboro, and that there was dissatisfaction voiced regarding the definition of bedroom.

Mr. Cohen stated that his law firm represents Real Estate Associates, but not on this particular project.

Jane Burns, a resident of 406 S. Greensboro Street and representing the Neighbors for the Responsible Development of Old Pittsboro Road, spoke in favor of the proposed ordinances. Ms. Burns stated that the alternative that limits the number of 4 bedroom units to 20% of the project would help their neighborhood. Ms. Burns stated that she feels 4-bedroom housing is more appropriate in some neighborhoods than others, and does

not feel it is appropriate for the Old Pittsboro Road neighborhood. Ms. Burns stated that the Old Pittsboro Road neighborhood is already diverse. Imposing the proposed type of apartment structure will not increase the diversity, but will decrease the diversity. Ms. Burns stated that she thought construction of four-bedroom units would target a small group of individuals. Ms. Burns stated that her neighborhood was not made aware of the Planning Board meeting at which the proposed ordinance was discussed.

Joe Jernigan, representing Real Estates Associates, stated that the site of the proposed apartment complex has been zoned for their proposed use for quite a number of years. Mr. Jernigan stated that their concern is for their proposed development whose plans were submitted to the town six months ago. Mr. Jernigan stated that he did not feel it was fair for the town to require them to change their plans at this stage of development. Mr. Jernigan asked that the town grandfather their development in if the Board chooses to revise the land use ordinance to limit the number of bedrooms.

Mike Altfilliseh, a resident of 103-B Todd Street, stated that the town is better served to consider developments on a case-by-case basis, and stated that he did not think that limiting the number of residents in apartments is practical.

Mr. Morgan stated that the task force to identify the process for public input on use of the community center portion of the Carrboro Baptist Church met and discussed what process would work best for Carrboro citizens. The members of the task force decided that the charette process would be the most suitable process to use. The architect selected to do the plans for renovations to the building will design this process.

The purpose of this agenda item was for the mayor and Board of Aldermen to discuss the recommendations for improvements around the Orange Regional Landfill as proposed by the Landfill owners Group/Landfill Neighbors Working Group.

Alderman Gist stated that it is being proposed that an Assembly of Governments meeting be held to discuss the recommendations from the Landfill Owners Group/Landfill Neighbors Working Group.

Mr. Morgan stated that the tentative date for the Assembly of Governments meeting is October 22, 1997.
