A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE FY2010-11 MANAGER'S RECOMMENDED BUDGET

The Board of Aldermen, prior to adopting the budget, is required by G.S. 159-15 (b) to schedule a public hearing. The public hearing is designed to receive community input on the Manager's recommended budget for the upcoming fiscal year. Following the budget hearing, the Board was requested to provide direction to the Town Manager for the final budget to be adopted on June 15th.

Allison DeMarco with Orange County Justice United, thanked the town for the steps it has taken, but stated that they believe the \$11.78 as recommended by the Town Manager is not sufficient to represent the cost of living in Carrboro, and suggested that the town approve the \$13.00/hour figure as recommended by Justice United. She asked that the Board consider the rising cost of living in Carrboro and that an indexing mechanism be added to ensure that wages are adjusted annually to the cost of living.

Robert Dowling with Community Home Trust thanked the Board for the town's support of the home trust.

PUBLIC HEARING ON THE LITCHFIELD AIS CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

Homestead Partners, LLC, as represented by Phil Post and Associates, has submitted an application for the construction of a 34-dwelling unit subdivision located at 900, 904 & 906 Homestead Road. The Conditional Use Permit, if approved, would allow the creation of 24 single-family-detached units, and 8 duplex units (to be combined with an existing duplex on site) yielding 34 dwelling units. The plan includes associated infrastructure such as utilities and publicly dedicated streets.

Jeff Kleaveland, one of the town's Zoning Development Specialists, was sworn in and made the presentation.

Tim Smith with Phil Post and Associates was sworn in and reviewed the project proposal.

Phil Post was sworn in and discussed the proposed playfields. He stated that they agree to support all staff recommendations. He stated that they agree to support the Planning Board's recommendations to provide a hedge or other border along the Lucas Lane frontage between the sidewalk and each of the play areas, in addition to shaded seating in the play areas. He also stated that they would be happy to suggest green building and sustainable features for the project.

Trish McGuire, the town's Planning Administrator, was sworn in. She stated that the land use ordinance states that all streets have to be connected.

Christine Westfall with Community Home Trust, was sworn in. She stated that the developer has agreed to build the Home Trust four new duplex units that will be 1,400 - 1,500 square feet. She stated that they have requested to be able to build the duplex units in the future because Homestead Partners is a land developer—not a builder.
